#### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR VIOLATIONS OFFICER

Howdy friends and neighbors of Spring Lake. Well June is in the past and did bring some rain, but we still could use some more. Summer activities and vacations are now in full swing with July and visitors are coming to share their summer in Spring Lake. School is out, so be aware of are young drivers and children playing in the parks and yards. With these things in mind, we have a few items that need to be addressed. I want to remind our residents that there are restrictions for all residents in each village. These HOA restrictions are provided on the website.


- 1. Please get a permit whenever you remodel, change, or improve your residence on the outside. Call SPLA and get an application for a building permit or go on our webpage and fill the permit out online.
- 2. Please use the Waste Connection Calendar to put your bulk waste and yard waste on the curb for the correct date for pickup. The Calendar is posted on our website.
- 3. When you cross an empty lot without permission, or park your auto, boat, or trailer on an empty lot, you are trespassing. Please do not do this.
- 4. If you have a dog and he barks for longer than 10 minutes, you are in violation of a noise restriction. Several complaints have been made about not picking up after your dog when walking the paths and streets of Spring Lake.
- 5. Be aware that when you put appliances or large furniture items on the street for pickup, you must call Waste Connections (863) 655-0005) so they can get additional help to pick it up.
- 6. We are having a rash of complaints about trucks, trailers and boats parked in yards and lots overnight and on weekends. This is a violation. You must put the trailer in storage, garage or behind a fence. Check your deed restrictions.
- 7. One thing I see is people driving too fast in golf carts, they are not cars, they are designed to be run on grass at a slow rate of speed and yet we jack them up and speed them up to the point they are sometimes unsafe. I have seen golf carts driving across empty lots (this is a violation, you are trespassing) Please stay on the street. I can see in the future, that if we continue to take advantage of the use of golf carts, we may lose that privilege of riding around in a GOLF CART. According to the State of Florida, you must be 16 years of age with a valid driving license to legally drive a golf cart.
- 8. Several complaints have been called in about speeding traffic in Spring Lake. I know everyone is in a hurry to get to town and back home. Please be aware that our speed limits here in Spring Lake are 25 and 35 MPH on the boulevard. Be aware that we have a security watch in Spring Lake and your driving is part of that SLOW DOWN. Please call the sheriff's office if you have any questions.
- 9. We have had several comments made that about residents that are not updating or displaying their street address on the front of their home. This is important because it helps first responders, mailmen, friends, and others who might want to know where you live. Please, help and take care of this matter.
- 10. One issue that we are faced with in Spring Lake is that some of us don't want to go by the rules or restrictions in our HOA. But we go by the rules when we drive, (stop signs and lights, speed limits, because if we don't, we lose our driving privileges. Maybe we need to start assessing a fee for not following our HOA restrictions. There were 169 violations written in the month of May which is ridiculous.

I want to thank you for the most part for a job well done. We could get even better if we would use some common sense and just get on a schedule and stick with it. I do not like writing citations any better than you like receiving them. If we work together and do our part, we could make a difference and make Spring Lake a better place to live. If we all put fourth some effort and help one another out, be neighborly and friendly, Spring Lake would be a great place to live.

\*We are happy to announce that the Pickleball Courts are now available for use. Like all other District amenities, it will be open dawn to dusk, and the entrance is electronically monitored, along with cameras. Since the courts were partially underwritten with a grant from the County Parks and Recreation Committee, they are open to the public. Our local Spring Lake Pickleball Club will be very involved in monitoring the facility and planning special events. A formal grand opening ceremony will take place in the Fall, when many members of the local Club will have returned from the north. There are no costs to use the courts, but people may join the Spring Lake Pickleball Club to participate in their various programs. Enjoy!!

\*The Fiscal Year '24 budget has gone through two drafts, and a public hearing is set for Wednesday, August 9, 10:00 a.m. at the District Office. Along with assessments and District utility rates and fees the Board of Supervisors will be establishing out of district costs for utilities and stormwater maintenance. The public is welcome and encouraged to attend and give input.

\*The Board has approved another fishing pier, to be located at the canal adjacent to the Bark Park, just past the restroom facility. Our contractor is backlogged with work, but the pier should be installed by September.

\*At the recent Florida Association of Special Districts State Conference in Orlando, a Memorial Award was presented to the District for Tim McKenna, who died in February. He was posthumously given the Board Member of the Year Award. Tim was an avid supporter of the Association and was a very involved Board member; he is missed.

\*Our sincere sympathy to the family of Spring Lake Developer Larry Boyd. Larry was building homes in the Blue Heron area of Spring Lake, and was a partner in the Shopping Plaza and Townhome project at the intersection of Rt. 98 and Floral. Larry and his wife Sherry have resided in Sebring Estates, just east of Spring Lake, for a number of years, and he was a big supporter of Spring Lake and wanted to be a part of its growth. Our thoughts and prayers are with the family.

\*There are still a number of areas in Spring Lake where the lack of light poles has hindered development and created very dark areas. A new pole installation from DUKE costs close to \$7,000 and tremendously limits how many poles can be installed. A lot of people think these poles are put in free of charge by DUKE, but that is not the case. The District is working with a company called StreetLeaf that installs completely solar powered lights at no cost, with a low monthly maintenance fee. If our negotiations are successful, the District will be able to "bring light" to a number of these dark areas.

The permit must be obtained from this office **BEFORE** you apply for a County permit. There is no charge for the SLPA permit.

If you have damaged or fallen trees on your property, or if you have a tarp that is blowing off, tattered and torn tarp on your roof, now is the time to take care of these issues before hurricane season begins.....

AND...Please remember you <u>may not</u> keep a boat, trailer, motor home, RV, camper, fifth wheel, etc. at your residence in villages II-VI.

# New Florida Law Restricts Teen Golf Cart Drivers. Here's What You Need to Know

A new bill signed by Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis is tightening restrictions for teens driving golf carts. The new law, House Bill 949, was approved by DeSantis last week. Under the bill, golf cart drivers under age 18 must be at least 15 with a learner's permit or 16 with a driver's license.

Under a new bill signed into law by Gov. Ron DeSantis, Florida teens won't be able to drive golf carts without proper identification. The new law is affecting communities across the state.

Also, anyone who is 18 or older must have a valid government-issued ID to drive a golf cart. Florida law had previously allowed anyone 14 and older to drive a golf cart. The law goes into effect on **July 1, 2023**. Violations will be noncriminal traffic infractions, similar to moving violations.

The new legislation will also require that you *carry* a government-issued I.D. *while driving a golf cart*, even if you are 18 or older.

The law authorizes water control districts to designate roads for golf cart use, as long as the districts receive approval from the county.

### What is considered a Golf Cart?

According to Florida statute, a golf cart is "a motor vehicle that is designed and manufactured for operation on a golf course for sporting or recreational purposes and that is not capable of exceeding speeds of 20 mph.

### **OFF HIGHWAY AND ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES**

- Off-Highway Vehicles are designed to be operated off-road. Ride only on designated trails, off paved roads, and at a safe speed.
- Off-highway vehicle operators and riders under the age of 16 must wear a USDOT approved safety helmet and eye protection. It is strongly encouraged that riders of all ages wear helmets and eye protection.
- Helmets are the most important piece of protective gear for safe off-highway riding. Always wear a compliant helmet when using an off-highway vehicle.
- Always wear a face shield or goggles to protect yourself from rocks, branches or bugs that can hit your face and cause distractions while driving. Sunglasses are not an appropriate substitute for safety goggles.
- Never drive an off-highway vehicle while impaired.
- Never carry a passenger on a single-rider off-highway vehicle, and no more than one passenger on an OHV specifically designed for two people.
- Ride an OHV that is right for your age; do not ride a machine that is too big for you.
- Anyone under the age of 16 operating an ATV on public land must be under the supervision of an adult and must have proof of completion of a Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (DACS) <u>safety course</u>.
- Always check tire pressure before riding; Over-inflated and under-inflated tires can cause difficulty steering.
- Use the buddy system, travel in a group of two or more riders, and never ride alone.
- Always provide someone with a ride plan, including where and when you are riding, and the time you
  expect to return.
- Remember to tread lightly. Riding behavior that harms the land is self-defeating and irresponsible. Learn to protect and preserve your riding areas.

Florida law states that all-terrain vehicles (ATV) may only be operated on unpaved roadways where the posted speed limit is less than 35 MPH and only during daylight hours. However, a county may choose to be exempt from this. Or alternatively, a county may, designate certain unpaved roadways where an ATV may be operated during the daytime as long as each such designated roadway has a posted speed limit of less than 35 miles per hour and is appropriately <u>marked to indicate permissible</u> ATV use.

Off-Highway and All-Terrain Vehicles are titled, but not registered, and are not required to be insured with PIP and PDL coverage. To title an ATV, submit a completed form <u>HSMV 82040</u> to a <u>Motor Vehicle Service Center</u>. (Sections 261.20, 316.2074 and 316.2123, Florida Statutes)

When summer temperatures reach extreme levels, the inside of a car can quickly become a death trap for children. According to the National Highway Traffic Administration heatstroke is the leading cause of vehicular not-in-traffic non-crash-related deaths for children under 14.

The majority of hot car deaths -54% – happen because someone forgets a child in a car. This often occurs when parents or caregivers forget to drop their child off at daycare because they've become distracted or are off their routine; the second leading cause -25% – of vehicular heatstroke deaths are when children get into unattended vehicles, either through an unlocked door or the trunk.

Families are encouraged to educate their children about the dangers of playing in hot cars – and to take every precaution possible to prevent another tragedy.

### **Tips for Keeping Kids Out of Cars**

- Get in the habit of always locking your car doors and trunk, year-round.
- Never let children play in an unattended vehicle. Teach them a vehicle is not a play area.
- Keep car keys out of a child's reach.
- If a child is missing, quickly check all vehicles, including the trunk.

Knowingly leaving a child is the third leading cause of vehicular heatstroke deaths.

 Never leave a child alone in a parked car, even with the windows rolled down or the air conditioning running. A child's body temperature can rise three to five times faster than an adult. When the body's temperature reaches 104 degrees, the internal organs begin to shut down.

### **Tips for Drivers**

- Set an alarm on your phone to go off around the time you usually arrive to work to remind you to check the back seat.
- If you need to run inside to retrieve something you forgot, take your child with you. Never leave a child alone in the car, not even for a minute.
- Arrange for day care or school to check in if your child doesn't show up as expected.
- Leave your purse, phone or diaper bag in the back seat as a visual cue to check for your child before exiting.
- Keep a stuffed animal in your child's car seat. When the child is with you, move it to the front seat as a reminder that your child is in the back.
- Place a reminder sticker on your windshield, dashboard or driver's side window —wherever you'll
  notice it—to remind yourself.
- Remove your kids from the car first and then worry about getting everything else out.
- If you see a child or pet alone in the car, call 9-1-1 immediately and follow the instructions of emergency personnel. In some states, laws will protect citizens if they break into a vehicle to save a person or animal.
